Founded in 1997, Riverstone International School is a private, independent PreK–12 school in Boise, Idaho. Riverstone is one of around 20 schools in the United States authorized to provide the full continuum of International Baccalaureate (IB) Programmes, including the Primary Years Programme (PYP), Middle Years Programme (MYP), and Diploma Programme (DP). In addition to the academically rigorous IB, all Riverstone students partake in the school's nation-leading outdoor and experiential education program, learning self-confidence, self-awareness, teamwork, leadership skills, and social/environmental responsibility.

### ACADEMIC PROGRAM

Riverstone's academic program revolves around the IB. Starting with the Middle Years Programme (MYP) in Grades 6 through 10 and culminating with the Diploma Programme (DP) in Grades 11 and 12, the IB is one of the most comprehensive, rigorous, and highly recognized college preparatory curricula in the world today. The Theory of Knowledge course; the 4,000 word Extended Essay research paper; the CAS requirement of approximately 150 hours of creativity, activity, and community service; the two-year commitment to at least five areas of study in Grades 11-12; the assessments scored using international standards make the IB program truly exceptional.

#### At Riverstone:

- The high school operates on a modified block two-semester system with an alternating schedule on Wednesdays focused on off-campus, experiential learning.
- All Grade 11-12 students are IB Diploma candidates (exceptions: min. 2 IB exams)
- Typical load: 3 Higher Level (HL) and 3 Standard Level (SL) courses in 5+ subject groups, as well as IB Core. Students may take four HL classes with permission but it is not advised by Riverstone or the IB.
- IB Core: Theory of Knowledge, Extended Essay (4,000 words), Creativity-Activity-Service (150 hrs in G11-12)
- In May of their senior year, all students take the IB Diploma exams. Juniors may also test in certain subjects as "anticipated candidates." Students learn the exam results in July.

### DIPLOMA PROGRAMME - GRADE 11/12

DP course options are listed below. DP students may choose not to take a Fine Arts course and take an additional Individuals & Societies or Science course instead. Advanced math students may place into AA in Grade 10, allowing them to take Calculus 3 in Grade 12. MYP and elective courses (listed on the next page) complete the 60 credits required to graduate.

### PRE-IB/DP COURSES - GRADE 9/10

Grades 6-10 in the IB are known as the Middle Years Programme (MYP). MYP courses taken in Grades 9-10 occur across eight subject groups (see below). Classes are interdisciplinary, inquiry-based, and skills-focused, with an emphasis on connecting learning to real-world issues, global contexts, and Approaches to Learning (ATL), such as research, collaboration, self-management, and critical thinking. Students also undertake the Personal Project in Grade 10, an independent, year-long project where students explore a topic of personal interest, develop a product or outcome, and reflect on their learning process in a formal report.
